The 2016-2018 County Executive Committee is the most successful CEC in history. More than 400 precinct chairs and coordinators served on the committee. We owe each one of them the greatest of gratitude. As they complete their two-year term, I share with you their major accomplishments.

2016 HOSTED TEXAS DEMOCRATIC PARTY CONVENTION

For the 1st time in 50 years, Bexar Democrats hosted a presidential year state convention. More than 15,000 Democrats attended and approved the most progressive party platform in our state party's history.

2016 BEXAR VOTER REGISTRATION TOPS ONE MILLION

Countywide voter registration drives were organized by precinct chairs, democratic clubs, and allied organizations. The goal was to reach the 1 million registered voters mark by November 2016. Collectively, we did it!!!

2016 GENERAL ELECTION SUCCESS

The BCDP Coordinated Campaign led us to victory. We won 27 of 27 contested countywide seats. We took back 3 Texas House seats. And, we elected the first female Constable in our county's history. Overall, we won 47 of 52 races in Bexar County. Thanks, Campaign Committee.

2017 PROGRESSIVE AGENDA

In addition to challenging Democrats to act like Democrats and calling our Republicans when they act like Republicans, we decided to take matters into our own hands. CEC members ran for mayor and city council. As a result, we now have the most progressive city council ever.

2017 RECORD MEMBERSHIP

The Precinct Chair Recruitment and Training Committee's efforts led us to a record number of CEC precinct chairs and coordinators. We are now present and engaging voters in all Bexar County neighborhoods.

2017 CANDIDATE RECRUITMENT

A record number of women are running, and we have candidates in all local, state, and federal legislative seats. Our ticket is gender balanced, ethnically diverse, and ready to stand up to Trump!!!

2018 PRIMARY ELECTION

CEC organized a successful primary under the leadership of Stephanie Carrillo: logistically (trained judges, convenient sites, vote-by-mail, early voting, election day) and politically (we outvoted Republicans for the 1st time in 10 years).

2016 - 2018 VOTER EDUCATION & VOLUNTEERS

Volunteers run the party. We averaged over 500 volunteer hours per month and became the first year-round political party operation in South Texas.

2016 - 2018 FUNDRAISING & TRANSPARENCY

The "Democratic Family Reunion" at La Villita has become our annual fundraising event and the largest gathering of Democrats in South Texas. Candidate contributions and sustaining memberships allow us to run a year-round operation. Diana Arévalo and Barbara Hawkins co-chaired the Combined Campaign. We are debt free and our finances are 100% compliant with the Texas Ethics Commission and Texas Secretary of State.
